Chairman's Report



Firstly, and importantly, we now have the prospect of the U.K. exiting Europe and the uncertainty that this brings. This note is being written immediately after the vote and so we will have to see what transpires but there is the serious possibility of reduced value of UK personal pensions and lower value of the pound. This may well impact on the demand for welfare assistance. Dealing with welfare comes in many forms as I have stated previously. Sometimes it is just as simple as giving advice. Our Statute is very specific in that it states that we exist as a charity solely to aid British people in the Var. This in itself is a severe constraint in that there are many deserving causes which we may have liked to assist from time to time but the Statute fetters us in this respect. We will have to see what transpires between now and the AGM next year but as at the time of writing the initial draft of this report halfway through the year, we have had no material requests for financial assistance since the start of the year.

Surprisingly however, at the last Committee meeting there were several matters requiring assistance. In the past we have offered assistance to those who may be infirm, unemployed or impecunious. We do have defined in depth checks that we make if a claim is made for financial aid but, at the same time, we hold substantial monies on deposit and it is frustrating not to be able to find deserving causes that fit our criteria. To this end we are proposing to deliver letters to doctors, Mairies, and certain other bodies stating our ability to offer assistance in the hope that this may draw out those in need. Initially this is to be to bodies local to Committee members. Whilst we do have a Welfare team we are conscious that we do not want to be inundated and so we will expand the distribution of letters according to initial demand. If, therefore, you, as a member, are aware of anybody in need of financial assistance please let us know. I would comment again however that we do carry out intense financial checks on individuals in order to ensure that they are in need of assistance.

Rise in “Home Help” benefits

Benefits for the over-60s intended to help people continue to live at home for longer have risen, in some cases by more than €400 per month. The Allocation personnalisée d'autonomie (APA) is aimed at preventing people becoming dependent. It is used to pay for home help and to fund work to adapt the home, but also to pay if a carer is taken ill. Access is via a doctor's assessment. The amount varies according to the level of disability.

Warning of “Free” scam from BAV member

Just a heads up for those people who may use 'FREE' for their phone and internet. We received an email the other day which was supposedly from Free stating that our bank had not paid the monthly direct debit for our mobile phone. On opening a link which basically asks if you want to continue your contract, a window opens which looks exactly like the Free log in page and asks for your log in info. We did not go any further because when we looked at the top log in bar on the computer it said and I quote "freelargeporn", hardly the login details for Free! We checked with our bank as a matter of courtesy and the direct debit had been paid on the correct date without a problem.

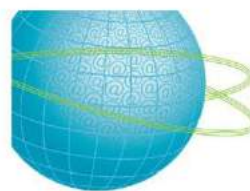

The Hermit of the Rock of Roquebrune-sur-Argens

Brother Antoine, Hermit of the Rock of Roquebrune-sur-Argens, is a former Cistercian novice who has lived as a hermit in the Var since 1966 and will celebrate his 50th anniversary of cave-dwelling



this year. He was born Louis Chauvel in 1923 and is from Mayenne. He has travelled many times in India where he supports medical projects for children and blind people. His spirituality, inspired mainly by Christian and Indian traditions, advocates asceticism, prayers and constant meditation. He has written several books in which humour has an essential place. His books include: "At the Heart of the Cave, Tales and Stories of a Hermit", "A Breath of Hermit"; and "The Path of the Rock".

Brother Anthony is also a draftsman and sculptor, composer and performer of many songs. It was love at first sight when he found the cave and he realised it was ideal for his planned life of contentment and asceticism. He lives there all year round, with a shady terrace and unspoilt view, and is rarely alone as visitors call in to bring him supplies, or just out of curiosity. At one point this became too much for him and he moved to another cave elsewhere for three years, but eventually returned to Roquebrune.

His cave is very bare: a mattress, some books, a camping stove and some cutlery. He lives without money and saves water from the rocks above through holes into the cave, which is lit by candlelight and heated by a wood fire. The owner of the land does not demand any rent from him. He has a rich sense of humour, sometimes scathing, and is well aware of the world around him. He says, with a broad smile: "I have come to seek joy in Roquebrune."

Semi Annual Financial Report - six months to 30th June.

Net income from subscriptions shows a healthy E356 or 10% increase over the same period last year. The additional costs of E418 (7%) in administration expenses derives mainly from increases in AGM expenses of E510, address book costs of E120 and newsletter costs of E180 which were partially offset by reductions in general office and website costs of E152 and essential travel costs of E252.

Newsletter sponsorship has increased over 2015 by E300 and functions income by a E270 - a very positive start to 2016. Interest income from the two savings accounts is being accrued each month and E666 has been accumulated - in 2015 it was credited to the accounts only towards the year end. These items mean that Other Income stands at E5,836 at the end of June compared to E4,645 in 2015.

Welfare costs have so far have only totalled E782 compared to E5,296 in 2015 but this reflects the sudden and non-foreseeable nature of this type of expense. Our Welfare team under Lorraine Strong have been working hard on a series of welfare cases but up to now there has been little requirement for funding as opposed to all kinds of help and advice. Old-time BAV members will know that this can change overnight.

We have the Vendange Lunch in September, the Christmas Lunch and various other social events in these last six months and because we do not

know what calls may be made on our Welfare funds, it is vital that we continue to receive your strong support, help and contributions for all this year's remaining functions.

Brexit petition

The House of Commons will debate a petition calling for a second EU referendum on Monday, 5 September, the Commons Petitions Committee has said. The committee, a cross-party group of MPs that is independent from the UK government, said its decision was swayed by the 'huge number of people' signing the petition. More than 4.1million signatures were recorded, but thousands of names turned out to be fake. The committee added that putting the petition forward for debate did not mean it supported calls for a second referendum and that it was 'too late' to change referendum rules - as the petitioner, a Brexit supporter, had demanded.



The petition - set up on 25 May, a month before the referendum - stated: "We the undersigned call upon HM Government to implement a rule that if the Remain or Leave vote is less than 60%, based on a turnout of less than 75%, there should be another referendum." Those who signed have received an email rejecting their demands, and saying that the government had 'been clear that this was a once-in-a-generation vote' and the result 'must be respected'. The committee added that the debate, in Westminster Hall, 'does not have the power to change the law, and won't end with the House of Commons deciding whether or not to have a second referendum'. "It will be up to the government to decide whether it wants to start the process of agreeing a new law for a second referendum," the committee said. The debate will be streamed live on parliamentlive.tv.

Town bans circuses with wild animals

One of the aspects of French life which may have come as a surprise is the number of circuses that regularly pitch camp in our towns and villages, but even more so the fact that they still have wild animals in the show. These animals can often be seen grazing on the edge of a parking area and evoke varying reactions from we

foreigners, from "Aaah, aren't they sweet!" to "How cruel!"



French local authorities are now getting involved in this thorny area and another town in the Var has become the latest to ban circuses with wild animals, prompting anger in the circus community. The town council at La Ciotat has banned such circuses from the commune, joining a dozen or so communes who have taken similar steps. La Ciotat's mayor, Patrick Boré, said the council had discussed the issue for more than a year and had concluded that the activities were against the well-being of animals, however the council did not have the means to carry out the welfare investigations which would have been required.



The ban has been attacked as "illegal" by the president of the circus and festivals union of Europe, Didier Girard. Mr Girard has written to the prefect of Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur region demanding that he "re-establish the laws of the republic" and overturn the ban. The union is already pursuing several similar cases in court. In the PACA region two other towns have already taken similar steps to ban circuses with wild animals: La Trinité in 2012 and Roquebrune-sur-Argens in 2015.
