Summer Soirée

Wind Farms

Probably most members of the BAV would support the use of renewable energy in its various forms (wind farms, hydro energy, solar panels etc.) albeit there may be concerns as to cost both in financial and environmental terms. Clearly, wherever these are located they are likely to have some local impact and there is likely to be some form of Nimby (not in my back yard) attitude but the authorities should site these energy sources in areas giving least impact, particularly having regard to the massive size of these projects (for example sheer land area for solar panels and height and area for wind farms).

According to a report on France 3, in 2020 the PACA Region proposes that 23% of the energy supplied will be in renewables. To help meet this target it is proposed that wind farms are installed in the Haute Var which will affect the villages of Aups, Tourtour, Villecroze and Salernes, regarded as places of natural beauty and great tourist attractions. A wind farm has already been proposed and objected to at Ampus. An association has been formed to respond to this and have an on-line petition.

Music Festivals in the Var

Music lovers are very fortunate to have two excellent summer festivals in the Var, one a relative newcomer and the other well-established over 10 years. Both aim to bring together musicians from the UK and France and feature music from much-loved composers, plus some new ones.



Festival de Musique Valois

This new festival based in Le Val is organised by British couple Raymond and Patricia Mellor, and features opera – outdoors if the weather permits. It results from a two week *stage* in July organised by “Love to Sing Holidays” where participants sing and play with local choirs and musicians, subject to audition, and present major works. This year two operas will be produced: “Dido and Aeneas” and “Carmen”, together with other concerts, in Le Val and Carcès. All concerts are free. Tax Planning Seminar

This is a special event of importance to all of us who are resident in France and therefore the booking forms will be published several months in advance.

Car hire with UK licence

The DVLA ended the paper counterpart of the UK driving licence on June 8 and this will affect what is asked for when hiring a car in France. Each hire company may have different requirements, but they should contact you in advance to notify you of this. It is recommended **that before leaving the UK all drivers obtain a unique 72 hour code from the DVLA View Driving Licence website** which confirms licence validity. If you wait until arrival at the car hire offices they may do this for you but you will need your National Insurance number.

Other possible requirements:

- A print-out of licence details from the DVLA View Driving Licence site.
- Photocard or old-style paper licence with a second form of ID.
- Photocard and sign a self-declaration on endorsements.
- Just show photocard.

Salad recipes Potato and pea Salad



500g new potatoes
150g fresh or frozen peas
3 tbsp olive oil
4 anchovies, chopped
1 tbsp capers, rinsed
1 tbsp mustard
Small handful chopped parsley

Cook potatoes in their skins until tender. When almost cooked, add peas and cook until tender. Mix olive oil, anchovies, capers, mustard and parsley. Season with salt and pepper and whisk with a fork. Drain potatoes and peas, allow to cool slightly, then cut potatoes into quarters. Add dressing while warm. Stir gently and serve cool.

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VISIT PROVENCE – places to go in the Var and beyond.

Caumont Centre d'Art, Aix-en-Provence

An opportunity to visit Aix should never be missed – to stroll along the beautiful Cours Mirabeau, enjoy a coffee at the Deux Garçons admiring the *hôtels particuliers* on the shady side of the street, and to explore the narrow streets of the old town with their shops, galleries, the cathedral, and yet more beautiful old buildings. On Tuesdays the market fills the entire length of the Cours Mirabeau, which is now pedestrianised.



However, there is now a new delight for art lovers as the Caumont Centre d'Art opened in May this year. The building is a magnificent 18th century *hôtel particulier*, designed in Parisian style, and with a lovely walled garden. It is situated just south of the Cours Mirabeau on Rue Joseph Cabassol and will house two major temporary exhibitions per year, plus the film "Cezanne in the Aix region" which is shown every day.

The current exhibition is devoted to the works of Canaletto, showing 50 works painted in Venice,



Rome and London, with explanatory panels in French and English. Audioguides in several languages are also available at a small extra cost. Reservations can be made on-line at www.expo-canaletto.com. It is on until 13 September.

There is a gourmet café in one of the major reception rooms, plus a terrace in the garden, where elegant lunches and teas are served, and a high-quality gift shop.

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English words in France

Good news for French-language learners - you'll soon be officially permitted to use a bunch of familiar words while speaking French. France's two main rival dictionaries, Le Petit Robert and La Petit Larousse, are set to release their 2016 editions and have leaked a few of the new words that made the cut. The new entries had to meet two criteria - be in popular use and be used frequently by the media and will not fall out of use in the short term. The 160th edition of the Larousse dictionary will contain 150 new additions, the most prominently English of which was "*le selfie*". It will be defined as "an auto-portrait photo, usually taken with a smart phone and put on social media.

English terms to make the cut revealed the growth in importance of technology and social media. They included the digital currency Bitcoin, Big Data, and Captcha - the word for the online challenge-respond test for logging into private accounts. Captcha, incidentally, is an acronym for Completely Automated Public Turing test to tell Computers and Humans Apart.

Community Manager also made it into the Petit Robert, while Larousse added "vegan" to its pages, to refer to those who believe animals are not the property of humans.

English words were just a small proportion of the new words that were accepted into the French dictionaries. The Larousse dictionary added the term VTC (*Vehicule de Tourisme avec Chauffeur*), which basically means a private hire cab - a move that will probably not go down well with traditional French cabbies. The French term "*Zadiste*" found an official home in Le Petit Robert dictionary a sign of how frequently it has been used in recent months. A "*zadiste*" refers to a protester who occupies a "zone to defend" such as those camped out at the location of a proposed new dam at Sivens, south west France last year. The recent controversy around pollution levels in French cities has resulted in *circulation alternée* (alternated traffic) and *particule fine* (fine particle) entering the Larousse. *Glamouriser* (to glamorize), *retropédaler* (to back pedal), *électrosensibilité* (electrosensitivity), *capitaliser* (to capitalize) and *surréagir* (to overreact) also made it into Larousse. And Le Petit Robert also added a couple of new French expressions into the dictionary - *Tendue comme un string* - (as tight/tense as a thong/g-string) and *maquillée comme un camion volé* (disguised/made up/given a makeover like a stolen lorry).
