Annual General Meeting 16 March 2016 - RULE 6: General Meetings

Members may participate in any discussion following the disclosure of written questions and the committee members' answer. There is also an opportunity to contribute to the meeting without written questions during the agenda item "Matters of General Interest". The rules that govern the procedures to be followed at a general meeting are printed below.

"Questions concerning the minutes and reports can only be made in writing and lodged with the Secretary not less than 7 days before the AGM. That is by 9 March. An appropriate person will answer. Any proposals from Members cannot be put to the vote. The Committee will discuss with the proposer and determine if the proposal can be put to the next general meeting. The purpose is to safeguard the association from passing illegal or unworkable solutions. Ideas for improving the effectiveness towards meeting our objectives may be discussed under "Matters of Interest"

La Poste warns of package scam



La Poste has warned of a scam in which people are urged to call a premium rate number to organise the collection of a package or registered letter. Although the

warning was issued by La Poste in Basse Normandie, the calls have been received in Hérault, Pays Basque and Mayenne.

The calls purport to be from La Poste informing householders that they have received a parcel or a letter recommandée waiting for them. The householder is told to call a number beginning with 08 to get more details about the package or letter. However, anyone calling this number is put on hold until they hang up - at a cost of €3/minute. There is no warning of the cost, so for many the first indication they had been scammed was their phone bill.

La Poste has issued the following reminders to avoid scams:

- For any undelivered parcels or letters, the postman should always leave a note that they called.
- La Poste never calls you and asks you to call an 08 number or other premium rate number
- La Poste never asks for your card details or pin whether by phone or email
- If you receive a message that purports to be from La Poste you can call their number on 3631 (standard landline rate in mainland France) to find out more.

International Space Station

If you go to www.spotthestation.nasa.gov and type in your country and, for the Var, the city of Toulon, it will give you a list of exact times and directions in which to look - but you'll need to put the alarm on!

Beware letters from water companies

Several of the main water utilities, including Véolia, have been sending out official-looking letters to tell customers they are obliged to take out insurance against water leaks. These letters contain several errors:

- Such insurance is obligatory not true.
- If you decide you need it, get a quote from your existing house insurance provider, as an option can be added and may be cheaper than that offered by Véolia.
- A leak inside the house is only covered if it has caused damage to walls, floors, etc.
- A leak outside the house is never usually covered (see point 2). The cost of searching for a leak, digging up the garden and reinstating it can be high.
- Excess water use will be charged to the customer – not always the case. This depends on who supplies your water. In any event, the water company cannot charge more than double the usual bill.
- The letters are sent to all users but only apply to those whose water meter is outside their property.

If you feel you have been misled by such a letter, or have paid over the odds for excess water usage due to a leak, the *Conciliateur* at your local Mairie may be able to advise you.

VISIT PROVENCE –

(places to go in the Var and beyond)

Châteaux de Vins, Vins sur Caramy

Listed in the Inventory of Historical Monuments, the castle overlooks the tranquil Caramy valley. It was built in 1542 on the site of an older building of the Gothic period, and belonged to the



Garde family (from Jaumegarde near Aix en Provence) who built it for their primary residence. The most emblematic figure of this family was Hubert, Count of Provence, who became famous during the wars of religion. The castle saw a period of transition from medieval fortress to Renaissance refinement and has a particular character.

It was abandoned for several decades but the ruined monument was saved at the initiative of three private owners. Now, restored as a centre of culture, the castle overlooks a tranquil nature reserve comprising the Caramy river valley and surrounding woodland hills.



For over 25 years l'Association de Sauvegarde et d'Animation Culturelle du Château de Vins has organised a summer festival in July and August called "Les nocturnes du château" with internationally renowned artists in the realms of music, theatre

New initiative for property sales

Buying or selling a property in 45 days by way of an invitation to tender on the Internet with full benefits of legal guarantees is now possible with the Immo-Interactif service of French Notaries. With this procedure, conceived a few years ago under the name Vente Notariale Interactive (VNI), (Interactive Notarial Sale), and renamed Immo-Interactif ®, the notaries conceived the real estate version of "eBay®", an innovative method of selling, which falls somewhere in between traditional negotiations and auction sales. It consists of an online invitation to tender, the execution whereof is orchestrated and secured by the notary.

The Immo-interactif process allows obtaining, within 45 days, the fair price of a property through the real time interaction between demand and supply. All this takes place with complete transparency because the bids are placed by potentials buyers on www.immobilier.notaires.fr, the official French Notaries real estate site, accessible to everybody online. The transaction is concluded only after the seller accepts, by signing the promise of sale, the offer that best meets his/her criteria, defined in the specific specifications that have been brought to the attention of potential buyers.

Sellers, buyers, Internet novices or experts, Immo-Interactif is available to everyone - the notary accompanies you during all the steps:

1. <u>Evaluation and preparation of the terms and conditions of sale</u>

The seller contacts his notary with the aim of selling his property. After having assessed the property by referring to the notarial real estate database and to his knowledge of the market, the notary determines the submission value of the property*, the terms and conditions and the schedule of the sale along with the seller and receives an exclusive authorisation for a very brief period: maximum six to eight weeks.

2. <u>Posting the property and the advertisement online</u>

The notary disseminates the property advertisement with photos, description, 1st possible offer*, dates and visiting schedule and of the sale on the site www.immobilier.notaires.fr. All useful information (diagnoses, town planning documents, plans, summary note of the property, etc.) is posted online. At the same time, the notary advertises the property through a powerful and targeted communication plan on different media.

3. Property visit and online registration of the sale The notary schedules property visits on predefined days and time slots. During these slots, which generally range over a period of 3 to 4 weeks, potential buyers visit the property, ask questions to the notary, if necessary, to obtain specific information and sign a request for approval (free and without any commitment), wherein they acknowledge having read the specific terms and conditions of sale. At the end of the visits, interested persons would register online on the website www.immobilier.notaires.fr to receive an electronic approval, which would be issued to them by the notary and would enable them to make their offers during the sale.

4. Conduct of the sale

The sale begins at the time and on the dates fixed by mutual agreement between the seller and the notary and lasts 48 hours. Only those who are registered and have received the notary's approval may participate and make their offers*. Potential sellers and buyers directly witness the issue of successive offers* that appear in the online sales room www.immobilier.notaires.fr in realtime.

5. <u>Selection of the offer and signing of the promise of sale</u>

At the end of the offer receiving period, the seller chooses the one that best fulfils his expectations: it is not necessarily the most expensive. Then, he signs a promise of sale in his notary's presence and the subsequent procedure takes place like a traditional sale.

* The presentation value and the offers include the brokerage fees and advertising costs

ATTENTION: the offers are made over a 48-hour period. In order to be able to participate in it, it is imperative to be registered before this period commences. Any offer made in the last 2 minutes postpones the end of the offer receiving period by 2 minutes. The sale ends only when no new offer has been made in the last 2 minutes. Despite this system, given the possible risks of slow connection or other computer malfunctions, it is highly recommended not to wait until the last minute to connect and make offers online because of the risk of being excluded.



More flights from Toulon and Marseille

From 2 July to 12 September, Flybe will operate a thrice-weekly service from Toulon to Southampton. Cityjet also operates flights from Toulon to London City.

A new summer service from Marseille to Olibia in Sardinia will fly twice a week from 26 July, operated by Meridiana.

UK voting and the EU Referendum

The British Embassy in Paris has asked us to raise awareness of registering as an overseas voter. There are approximately half a million Brits living in France, many of whom are eligible to vote, and it is important that their voices are heard in the forthcoming EU referendum which is due to take place before the end of 2017. As the Prime Minister has said, this will be "the most important decision the British people will have to take at the ballot box in our lifetimes".

Although the exact date has still to be decided, the eligibility criteria for this important referendum will be based on UK parliamentary elections. This means British citizens can vote if they were registered to vote before they left the UK and have lived in France for less than 15 years. So far only 5% of overseas voters have registered. It is quick and easy to do so and only takes five minutes. It can be done online at www.gov.uk/register-to-vote.

Many of us who have been here longer than 15 years have had our right to vote removed, despite recent campaigns and petitions, so we rely on the rest of you who are eligible to ensure the UK stays in the EU so that our rights as EU citizens in France are not affected.

SNCF new charges



SNCF has announced that all modifications or cancellations will be charged to travellers from April onwards. Until now it was possible to change or cancel tickets free of charge 24 hours before

departure. As of April any modifications or cancellations will cost 5 euros, with modifications made on the actual day of departure costing 15 euros.

views over the Argens valley and the Maures hills.

A project is in hand to build a new electronic observation table which interacts with smartphones and tablets, giving information about the views, by the use of electronic chips in the concrete. This will be a feature unique in France. Look out for local information about its launch.

Bonus for changing to electric or hybrid car – follow-up

In December we ran an article about the new "green" disc for cars which is part of an antipollution campaign in France. As with many of these government schemes, the proposed start date of 1 January 2016 has been delayed.

However, the other part of this scheme involved a large bonus for those trading in a pre-2001 diesel vehicle for a new electric or hybrid one.
